




Prohibited CA Equipment and Features

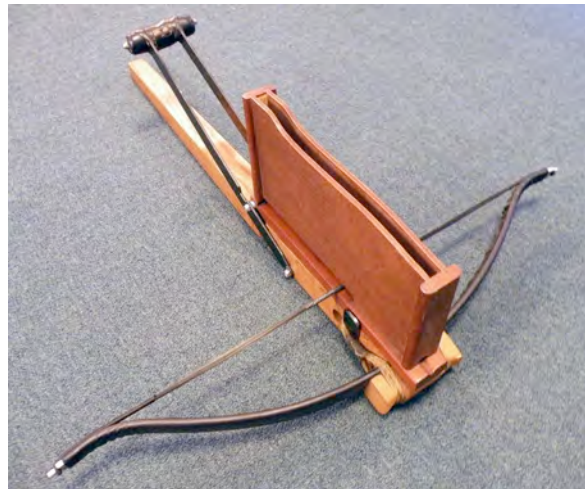
Forward pistol grip

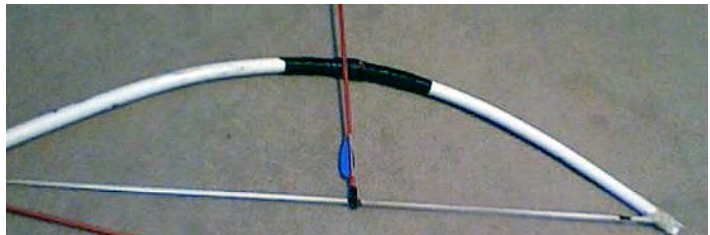
Split-prod design for crossbows utilizing a center-shot system
